For 155 years, Children's National Hospital in Washington, D.C., has delivered expert pediatric care at every milestone. As the region's only standalone children's hospital, kids have been the center of our mission since 1870. Today, we are one of the top 10 children's hospitals in the nation and ranked in all specialties evaluated by U.S. News & World Report. Children's National is transforming pediatric medicine for all children.

Children's National is home to the Children's National Research Institute and Sheikh Zayed Institute for Pediatric Surgical Innovation. The Children's National Research & Innovation Campus is a first-of-its-kind pediatric hub dedicated to developing new and better ways to care for kids. We have been designated four times in a row as a Magnet® hospital,

demonstrating the highest standards of nursing and patient care delivery. We are an academic health system that offers expert care through a convenient, community-based primary care network and specialty care locations in the D.C. metropolitan area, including Maryland and Virginia. We are recognized for our expertise and innovation in pediatric care and as a strong voice for children through advocacy at the local, regional and national levels.

In 1988, Children's National founded Safe Kids Worldwide, a non-profit dedicated to reducing unintentional injuries among children through comprehensive national and global education, research and advocacy. As a non-profit, Children's National relies on generous donors to help ensure that every child receives the care they need.

- **Children's National Research & Innovation Campus**, which opened in 2021, is a first of its kind pediatric research and innovation hub. It houses the Children's National Research Institute (CNRI), a leader in basic and clinical research programs. It is anchored by our Center for Precision Medicine and Genomics Research and our Rare Disease Institute.



- **In addition to our primary emergency department** at the main campus, Children's National physicians also provide pediatric emergency care at Cedar Hill Regional Medical Center GW Health in Washington, D.C.



- **Community hospital NICU partnerships:** Our Division of Neonatology partners with community hospitals to extend the quality care offered at the Children's National NICU to families across the region.



- **Community-focused programs and partnerships**, including school health services, mobile health services and safety initiatives.



- **The URAC- and ACHC-accredited Children's National Specialty Pharmacy** supports children with complex conditions through medication management, education, on-site compounding and free delivery throughout the DMV.

✓ Education

Each year, pediatric training is provided for more than 1,000 medical students, with 384 third-year medical students from George Washington University (GW), 107 third-year medical students from Howard University, 460 fourth-year students from GW and other medical schools, and 54 physician assistant students.

The Children's National graduate medical education (GME) office provided clinical training to 121 pediatric residents, 8 dentistry residents, 12 child neurology residents, 2 medical genetics residents and 162 fellows, in addition to providing core pediatric training to 731 rotating GME trainees from the region's hospitals.

✓ Advocacy and Community

Safe Kids Worldwide, founded by Children's National in 1988, works to reduce preventable injuries to children ages 0-19. Safe Kids works with more than 400 coalitions in the U.S. and reaches nearly 7 million children and families annually through booster and car seat inspections and other safety programming.

The Child Health Advocacy Institute (CHAI), launched in 2007, focuses on child-centered policies and works to address community health needs including mental health and health literacy. In partnership with community organizations, government agencies and individuals, Children's National provided more than \$137 million in community benefit and supported more than 140 programs and activities in fiscal year 2025. We provide community-based care for children through programs such as IMPACT DC asthma care, Mental Health CORE, Early Childhood Innovation Network (ECIN), FLiP Rx and other "food is medicine" initiatives, school-based health centers

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
