parents, caregivers, local providers, advocates and others participated in at least one webinar from the mental health webinar series led by Children's National and CareFirst BlueCross BlueShield. The series focused on topics including: Social Media and Youth Mental Health, Questions Parents Have About Accessing Children's Mental Health Services and Parental Mental Health.

community members and stakeholders participated in the 2025 Community Health Needs Assessment and Community Health Improvement Plan 2025 to 2028 process through community conversations, interviews, input forms as well as youth engagement activities.

50+ 

community members participated in hands-on education provided by IMPACT DC on asthma awareness and management as well as how to avoid common triggers, recognize asthma symptoms and proper use of an inhaler and spacer.

18 

high school students participated in Project Insight, a youth empowerment program that aims to develop young leaders in public health. They learned about disaster preparedness, social drivers of health and health justice.
